- 4. Plaintiff failed to adequately respond to these interrogatories and a motion to compel was necessary.
- 5. The first hearing on the motion to compel was held on December 3, 2003, Magistrate Judge Nowinski presiding. Plaintiff was ordered to provide the requested information and to pay \$625 in sanctions to Districts.
- 6. Plaintiff failed to comply with the court's order and a second motion to compel with a request for dismissal was filed by Districts.
- 7. On February 4, 2004, Magistrate Nowinski again ordered Plaintiff to provide a full response to Districts' discovery requests.
- 8. Plaintiff supplied minimal further discovery responses, but has never paid the monetary sanction ordered by the Court.
- 9. Plaintiff's counsel was specifically told by Magistrate Nowinksi at a follow-up order to show cause hearing regarding dismissal on February 25, 2004, that he would not be allowed to call witnesses at trial who were not disclosed to Defendants during discovery.
- 10. Districts propounded two sets of Requests for Production of Documents under Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, rule 34, requiring the disclosure and production of all documentary evidence supporting Plaintiff's claims in this case.
- 11. Most recently, Districts propounded Request for Production of Documents, Set No. Two, on August 4, 2003.
 - 12. Plaintiff failed to adequately respond to this request and produced no documents.
- 13. Thus, a motion to compel was necessary. The first hearing on the motion to compel was held on December 3, 2003, Magistrate Judge Nowinski presiding.
- 14. Plaintiff was ordered to provide the requested information and was ordered to pay \$625 in sanctions to Districts.
- 15. Plaintiff failed to comply with the court's order and a second motion to compel with a request for dismissal sanctions was filed by Districts.

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
